2	welcome to the public hearing session of
3	tonight's Planning Board meeting.
4	I would like to start off with I am
5	sorry, with the attendance.
6	DEPUTY COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Mona
7	Fraitag.
8	ALTERNATIVE BOARD MEMBER FRAITAG: Here
9	DEPUTY COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Michael
10	Golden.
11	BOARD MEMBER GOLDEN: Here.
12	DEPUTY COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Walter
13	Simon.
14	CHAIRMAN SIMON: Here.
15	DEPUTY COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Tom Hay.
16	BOARD MEMBER HAY: Here.
17	DEPUTY COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Note for
18	the record that Board Members Hugh Schwartz,
19	Kirit Desai, and Viola Taliaferrow are not
20	present this evening.
21	Thank you.
22	CHAIRMAN SIMON: I would like to make a
23	comment about Hugh Schwartz' absence.
24	Unfortunately Hugh took a bad fall and injured
25	his back and he did break some bones but

luckily no surgery is required.

He will be going to rehab for -- we don't know for how long but hopefully he will be able to join us early next year.

As you know we only have one meeting in December and he will not be able to be at that meeting. Hopefully by early next year he will be able to rejoin us.

We are all very sad of Hugh's injuries.

We always enjoyed working with him and we look forward for him to return. He is really a critical part of this Planning Board. He is very knowledgeable. He could be opinionated and most of us are. We are not afraid to express our opinion but one of the things that I like about Hugh and the members of this Planning Board that we can take a position on something, look at the facts, make a decision based upon the facts and move onto the next project with no personal animosity.

That's something that we really enjoy and we miss Hugh and we wish him the best.

With that said, we will go to -- well, and then the other thing that we found out this evening that Johan Snaggs will be voted

3	Board meeting.
4	CHAIRMAN SIMON: I am sorry, Town Board
5	meeting I think they moved the day to Monday?
6	DEPUTY COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Correct,
7	Monday November 25th.
8	CHAIRMAN SIMON: They will take vote
9	an official vote. We look forward to Johan
10	joining us afterwards.
11	The first thing on our agenda this
12	evening is 6 Westchester View Lane.
13	This is a minor wetlands application
14	earlier in the work session we heard the
15	application and so now for the benefit of the
16	public, we would ask the applicant to describe
17	the project for the public and this Board.
18	DEPUTY COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Just for
19	the record, quickly, this is case number PB
20	19-21.
21	Thank you.
22	WILLIAM BESHARAT: Again, my name is
23	William Besharat. I am here representing the
24	owners.
25	As I stated earlier this is a proposal

to install an in-ground swimming pool in the backyard of an existing house within the vicinity of an existing fenced in area.

The house completely and the backyard completely exists within the 100-foot wetlands buffer. The proposed action has been carefully designed to create the minimum impact on the wetlands during the construction and afterwards. As I stated, the swimming pool is a fiberglass one-piece unit which minimizes the duration of the construction substantially actually versus a concrete or steel wood liner swimming pool.

The brick pavers that we are proposing, we are proposing also a cultec system to accommodate the runoff water and creek before it goes into the wetlands. As stated earlier, the wetland buffer is completely protected with the permanent fence that is existed and will have to exist for the life of the swimming pool.

So the swimming pool has actually a positive impact on the wetlands.

CHAIRMAN SIMON: Any questions from the Board Members?

1 DEPUTY COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: I iust 2 want to note for the record and for the 3 public, again, that this project was referred 4 to the Conservation Advisory Council as 5 required under Chapter 280 of the Town Code. 6 The Conservation Advisory Council on 7 October 1, 2019 issued a positive 8 recommendation back on this project with 9 recommendation that the pool and related patio 10 and proposed cultec recharger units are not located within the conservation easement area 11 12 which has been done by the applicant. And 13 also that if pool water is to be removed, it 14 be trucked off site and appropriately disposed 15 of.

WILLIAM BESHARAT: Correct, that has been addressed already.

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CHAIRMAN SIMON: I would also like to add a comment that I said in work session that the applicants has a physical fence between their usable property and the conservation area and what that does is that many times you have a separation between conservation area and useable area but no physical barrier and over years you get what I call "lawn creep"

1 that the lawn gets wider and wider and wider 2 into the conservation area. 3 The benefit of this particular design 4 that they have a physical fence. Was it a 5 six-foot fence I believe? 6 WILLIAM BESHARAT: Yes, it is. 7 CHAIRMAN SIMON: That's around their 8 useable property that divides that piece of 9 property from the conservation area. 10 So there is really -- you would not 11 have access to the conservation area from your 12 backyard and from the original design there 13 was part of the original design was the 14 planting of vegetation in the conservation 15 area which was done and it is in very good 16 shape so it is a well-maintained conservation 17 area that I saw plus it has a fenced to divide 18 it. 19 So I have no -- absolutely no problem 20 with this application and I have no objection 21 to it. Is there anyone in the audience that 22 would like to speak to this application? 23 If not --24 DEPUTY COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: I would

just recommend to the Board that it considers

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1	qualifying the project as a minor project. It
2	does meet the requirements under the Town Code
3	as a minor project. If the Board agrees, it
4	also qualifies a Type 2 Action under SEQRA, if
5	the Board agrees, you may vote on that and if
6	you also would consider turning the matter
7	over to the Town Wetland Inspector for a
8	decision.
9	BOARD MEMBER HAY: Those are three
10	separate things.
11	CHAIRMAN SIMON: Yeah, three
12	separate
13	DEPUTY COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Yeah,
14	really two, so that it qualifies as a minor
15	project and therefore also
16	CHAIRMAN SIMON: Wait a minute. Wait a
17	minute.
18	BOARD MEMBER GOLDEN: Type 2?
19	CHAIRMAN SIMON: Wait a minute.
20	DEPUTY COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Minor
21	project and a Type 2.
22	BOARD MEMBER GOLDEN: So moved.
23	BOARD MEMBER HAY: Second.
24	CHAIRMAN SIMON: All in favor?
25	ALTERNATE BOARD MEMBER FRAITAG: Aye.
