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1	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Let's go into the Public
2	Hearing. This is Case PB 23-16, Little Dragon Day Care.
3	VICE CHAIRPERSON HAY: Do we need to take
4	attendance up here?
5	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Yes, we do. Thank you,
6	Tom, for that. I appreciate that.
7	VICE CHAIRPERSON HAY: I know a few things, not
8	many.
9	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: You do. My brain is in a
10	fog today. Mr. Schmidt, would you take attendance, please?
11	DEPUTY COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Sure. Chairperson
12	Schwartz?
13	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Here.
14	DEPUTY COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Mr. Hay?
15	VICE CHAIRPERSON HAY: Here?
16	DEPUTY COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Mr. Desai?
17	BOARD MEMBER DESAI: Here.
18	DEPUTY COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Mr. Snaggs?
19	BOARD MEMBER SNAGGS: Here.
20	DEPUTY COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: On Zoom we have
21	Ms. Davis?
22	BOARD MEMBER DAVIS: Here.
23	DEPUTY COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Absent this evening
24	are Mr. Golden and Mr. Simon.
25	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Okay. We have one case

1	tonight, which is PB 23-16, Little Dragon Day Care, 130
2	Central Park Avenue. It's for a Planning Board Special
3	Permit for a daycare facility. This was previously a
4	daycare facility in the church facility. And they are
5	doing it again.
6	VICE CHAIRPERSON HAY: It's called Little Dragon
7	Day Care.
8	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Little Dragon Day Care, I
9	did announce that. I would like the applicant to just
10	briefly, maybe five minutes, if possible, describe the
11	project for the public and the Board.
12	DEPUTY COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Okay. So we have
13	Ms. Cheng on Zoom. Ms. Cheng, are you there and able to
14	present?
15	MS. XINGLI CHENG: Yes, I am. Can you hear me?
16	DEPUTY COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Yes. Do you need
17	me to share the drawings or is that something you're able
18	to do via the share screen?
19	MS. XINGLI CHENG: Actually, you can share the
20	drawing actually.
21	DEPUTY COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Okay. Do you have
22	a video that you can turn on?
23	MS. XINGLI CHENG: Okay. Let me just see here.
24	DEPUTY COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Great.
25	MS. XINGLI CHENG: Can you see me?

1	DEPUTY COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Yes.
2	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Yes, we see you.
3	DEPUTY COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: And I have the
4	drawings up.
5	MS. XINGLI CHENG: Yeah. And can I start?
6	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Yes, please.
7	DEPUTY COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Yes, go ahead.
8	MS. XINGLI CHENG: Yeah. Like, you know,
9	basically, we're going to, you know, open up a daycare at
10	130 North Central Avenue. And previously, this was a
11	nursery school and for the past 30 something years.
12	And we're bilingual. Little Dragon Daycare we're
13	bilingual. And we have a very unique and, you know, market
14	end to actually fulfill the need of the parents and
15	especially a lot of the parents, they need bilingual.
16	Either they have an Asian origin or they don't. They want
17	their kids to learn a second language. And so this is very
18	beneficial and for the young kids.
19	And so the capacity of this place and it's going
20	to be 30 kids and at full capacity. And, you know, like I
21	mention last time, it's bilingual and there is a lot of
22	need in this community. And basically, we have a lot of
23	require or demand from a lot of parents. And they are
24	looking forward for us to open a secondary location.
25	And you know, if we provide reliable service

Actually, we do. We have a very good, you know, reputation among the community, and the high-level reliable service for day care. The parents, they can feel at ease, and they can, you know, go to work and know their child is in good taken care of, not only in a safe and good environmental, but also we provide a lot of, you know, learning opportunity for the younger kids.

And basically, our age group is from two to four. That's the age group that we focus on.

CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Ms. Cheng, if you don't mind, could you focus on the operational part of it?

Because that's really -- I think we understand the concept.

If you could focus on like the hours, how people come and go there, the number of employees and all that stuff, that would be very helpful for us.

MS. XINGLI CHENG: Okay, okay, definitely. So there is going to be six teachers. And this is, you know, and there is going to be three classes. And we're going to have a two-year old class and between ten to 12 kids. And there is going to be a mixed-age classroom.

Which we utilize two classroom between the year three and to four. So the hours are -- Currently, we have, you know, operation from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. And we provide lunch and we provide, you know, snack. We also have outdoor play area.

1	If you can see, and right in front of building,
2	and there is 18 by 18, six-feet privacy fence and make sure
3	the kids going to not only have an outdoor activity, but
4	also they are going to be in a safe environment. And in
5	term of other detail, maybe you can, you know, give me
6	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Sure. Well, one of the
7	things, obviously, the people worry about with these kinds
8	of things, there kind of being a rush of people at one
9	time. How do people come? Do they come at one time or do
10	they come
11	VICE CHAIRPERSON HAY: Staggered.
12	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Staggered, thank you.
13	MS. XINGLI CHENG: No, they staggered, yeah.
14	They don't come at one time.
15	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: So there is no back up of
16	traffic ever?
17	MS. XINGLI CHENG: Not at all.
18	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Okay. All right. Any
19	other questions from the Board right now?
20	BOARD MEMBER DESAI: Yes. How many kids would be
21	in the playground area at one time?
22	MS. XINGLI CHENG: The capacity is 30, for 30
23	kids.
24	VICE CHAIRPERSON HAY: Just for the playground,
25	how many at one time?

1	MS. XINGLI CHENG: Playground by class. We don't
2	have them all come together. So one, basically, some of
3	the kids like, for example I just give you an example.
4	Two-year old will come maybe 11:45 to 11 I'm just trying
5	to see.
6	But anyway, so earlier class, the older class,
7	from the three, four, they probably going to come 10:15 to
8	11:30. Then the second group, after the kids going for
9	lunch, and so the second, the younger, two-year old, they
10	all coming for outdoor play.
11	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: How many children, though,
12	at a time will be in the enclosure, that I think was
13	Kirit's question. Yes?
14	BOARD MEMBER DESAI: Yes.
15	MS. XINGLI CHENG: About I think about 12 to
16	maximum 15.
17	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Okay.
18	BOARD MEMBER DESAI: Okay, because it looks a
19	little bit smaller area, for 300 square feet, for 15 or 20
20	kids. And then you have a play equipment in there. So I
21	think
22	MS. XINGLI CHENG: No. There is only We play
23	outdoor game. We don't have any equipment over there in
24	order to ran. So there going to be, you know, fresh air.

We do outdoor, you know, do little dance and music and so

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1	on and so forth.
2	BOARD MEMBER DESAI: Okay. I just want it to be
3	not too crowded because then the kids will start running
4	outside and playing outside. So that's concerning, to be
5	secured
6	MS. XINGLI CHENG: Actually, no.
7	BOARD MEMBER DESAI: No?
8	MS. XINGLI CHENG: Yeah, there is no such
9	like, you know, the space is actually We spoke to the
10	child Counsel, like Mr. Bacter(ph). He told us it's okay.
11	You know, the purpose of the outdoor is a lot of
12	kids to, you know, during the day, they stay inside for a
13	couple of hour. They need to have some fresh air. So
14	that's the only purpose. You know, change of setting is
15	good for their development.
16	BOARD MEMBER DESAI: Sure, okay.
17	DEPUTY COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: And it will be
18	fenced in with a gate and there will be supervision by the
19	teachers, right?
20	MS. XINGLI CHENG: Absolutely. Two teachers,
21	going to be minimum two teachers and going to be right over
22	there. And going to be two exit in the fenced area.
23	DEPUTY COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Okay.
24	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Any other questions from
25	the Board?

Aaron, you have a few little details to fill in?

DEPUTY COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Yes. So I think we covered the playground, which is going to be approximately 324 square feet surrounded by a six-foot high vinyl privacy fencing.

The applicant is also requesting a waiver from the Planning Board for landscaped buffer area around the playground. They have the solid fencing proposed. They are up along Central. There aren't residential --

CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: That's our jurisdiction?

DEPUTY COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: You have that
jurisdiction, yes.

CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Okay.

DEPUTY COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: And the applicant has identified parking spaces for a parent dropoff and pickup of children and is proposing the addition of a striped crosswalk in the parking lot area.

At the request of this Board, we did reach out to our Greenburgh Police Department Traffic and Safety regarding any accident data in the vicinity of the project site along Central Park Avenue and Jane Street.

There was one reported accident in the last -over the past five years. So it wasn't deemed -- There
weren't any traffic calming measures deemed necessary in
connection with the project.

1	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Good enough, okay.
2	Anybody from the public? Do we have anybody on Zoom that
3	wants to speak?
4	DEPUTY COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Is there anyone on
5	Zoom that wishes to speak on this project at this time? If
6	so, now would be the time. I'll stop the share screen.
7	DEPUTY TOWN ATTORNEY MAGANA: I just wanted to
8	clarify. I think, Aaron, you talked about the crosswalk.
9	I believe it's my understanding the parents walk the
10	children inside.
11	DEPUTY COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: They will, that's
12	right. I believe we had Dr. Zonan had requested. I don't
13	know if Dr. Zonan is just listening in or if you wish to
14	speak on this application.
15	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: This would be the time,
16	Mr. Zonan if you want to speak.
17	(Whereupon, there was no response.)
18	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Okay, we will see if there
19	is anybody from the audience that would like to speak and
20	then we will
21	DEPUTY COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Mr. Bodin.
22	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: We will come back. If
23	he's back here.
24	DEPUTY COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Okay.
25	MR. MURRAY BODIN: My name is Murray Bodin. I'm

respectful.

qualified to speak on this subject because I've met with the traffic committee that designs the manual and uniform traffic control devices for over 30 years. I, too, was designed the dotted line that defines an auxillary lane.

I've spoken to the National Committee at least twice requesting uniformity in the traffic manual. So my experience, I'm an experienced traffic. I can speak on traffic issues.

I will speak on one tonight because we have to start somewhere and realize that some of the things we've been doing are not correct.

CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Are any of those things related to this particular project, Mr. Bodin? We're only speaking about this project tonight. As I told you --

MR. MURRAY BODIN: I expect you to respect me -CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: I am being very --

MR. MURRAY BODIN: Just a minute --

CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: I am being very

MR. MURRAY BODIN: I'll wait.

CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: I'm being very respectful.

I said this before, and I will say it again. This Board is a ministerial board. We execute the laws that on the books. We don't create new laws. That is the Town Board's job.

1	If you have suggestions, and I know you've got
2	some good ones, okay, if you got those suggestions, I
3	suggest that you go to the Town Board meeting and give them
4	there. Giving them here while people are waiting on their
5	projects is not something that's productive because it's
6	nothing we specifically can do about it.
7	I'm happy, if you have a specific comment about
8	this project, and you've had some very constructive
9	comments on projects. Captain Lawrence I can remember, for
10	example, okay
11	DR. DANIEL ZONAN: In the church meeting
12	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: I don't know who that is,
13	but they should be on mute. Thank you.
14	So I'm happy to have you speak on this. If there
15	is anything specific that you see here, I'm happy to listen
16	to that. But it has to be on this project.
17	MR. MURRAY BODIN: I refer to the agenda for
18	tonight. It says the addition of a striped crosswalk in
19	the parking lot.
20	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Okay. So if you want to
21	talk about that, that's fine. Go ahead.
22	MR. MURRAY BODIN: Okay.
23	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Right, let's focus on
24	that.
25	MR. MURRAY BODIN: Greenburgh has been very

interested in pedestrian safety for years. The only crosswalk that looks the same to the driver is the European bar crosswalk. It's mandatory in New York City, the State of Connecticut, the State of California and many other places.

Greenburgh has permitted the zebra crosswalk to be used all over without question. And I question the safety of it. I just came over tonight on Secor Road. The light turned green. The guy in front of me didn't move because he was texting. I honked the horn and he moved.

A distracted driver today looks up, needs to see the crosswalk the same every single time and it's not. It is permitted to ones that you're using, but they are not the safest.

CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: So what would you be suggesting in this particular case --

MR. MURRAY BODIN: I am speaking. Are you going to interrupt me? Or are you going to let me finish?

CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: I am asking you a question, Mr. Bodin. Okay, I'm trying to be constructive. If you want to be combative --

MR. MURRAY BODIN: We've had an adversarial -CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: If you want to be -MR. MURRAY BODIN: We've had an --

CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: If you are going to be

1	combative, you can be. And I will get you thrown out,
2	okay.
3	MR. MURRAY BODIN: You'll get me thrown out, be
4	my guest.
5	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: If you would like to make
6	a comment
7	MR. MURRAY BODIN: You just threatened to throw
8	me out
9	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Yes, I did.
10	MR. MURRAY BODIN: which is against what you
11	should do.
12	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: No. I'm
13	MR. MURRAY BODIN: You're required to listen to
14	me and when I'm through, you can comment.
15	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: I'm asking a question.
16	MR. MURRAY BODIN: I am speaking on the agenda as
17	written
18	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: I agree. And I'm asking a
19	question about what you just said. I want to build on
20	something you said.
21	I just looked at the plans. The plans currently
22	have that what you're calling a zebra crosswalk.
23	MR. MURRAY BODIN: Right.
24	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: So what you're saying
25	is

1	MR. MURRAY BODIN: It should be changed to a
2	parallel bar crosswalk.
3	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Could you explain what a
4	parallel bar crosswalk is?
5	MR. MURRAY BODIN: It's a series of bars that
6	when a driver looks at them, he sees a series of bars.
7	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Are they raised?
8	MR. MURRAY BODIN: Not at an angle, not as a
9	zebra. The original zebra crosswalks were created years
10	ago when people did not understand crosswalks. So they
11	made a variety of them.
12	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Okay. So that
13	MR. MURRAY BODIN: The world changed. This is
14	2023. You cannot use designs of roads that were designed
15	50 years ago. They were designed for a world that doesn't
16	exist today.
17	VICE CHAIRPERSON HAY: So your recommendation is
18	to change from what is on the plan to a parallel line
19	crosswalk?
20	MR. MURRAY BODIN: Right.
21	VICE CHAIRPERSON HAY: Like what would look like
22	a ladder, kind of, right?
23	MR. MURRAY BODIN: Without the end bars. The
24	same, you have a few in Town
25	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Okay.

MR. MURRAY BODIN: But not all. 1 CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: It's something we will 2 definitely suggest to the applicant and talk to the police 3 4 about it. 5 But if you think it's something that should be done Town-wide, I really strongly suggest you make that 6 7 recommendation to the Town Board. I'm just telling you. 8 MR. MURRAY BODIN: For your information, at the 9 meeting last night, it was recommended that I meet with 10 Garrett, which I told you. And I sent an email to Garrett. 11 You may not have seen. 12 That we sit down and work out this before we have 13 to go through this kind of thing at every single meeting. 14 I've yet to hear from Garrett when we will meet and discuss 15 it. 16 CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Okay. 17 MR. MURRAY BODIN: Can I continue? 18 CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Yes. I'm just saying --19 MR. MURRAY BODIN: Your traffic consultant is 20 also in error. And he's welcome to be in that conversation. This has to be corrected once and for all 21 22 for safety reasons. It's brought up time and time again 23 that we want pedestrian safety in Greenburgh. Well, this 24 is the first step. Thank you. 25 CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Well, one of the

1	recommendations, Mr. Bodin, you should contact Lucas
2	Gioffre. Lucas has been heading a traffic safety committee
3	for the Town. In fact, they are just putting out a report
4	now. So I would suggest you talk to him as well because I
5	think he does have the ear of the Town Board on safety
6	measures.
7	MR. MURRAY BODIN: Lucas emailed me sometime
8	within the last ten days about
9	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Great.
10	MR. MURRAY BODIN: getting together. And I
11	suggested to him IUp until now, I have stood here and
12	made suggestions. From here going forward, I want to be
13	part of the group that writes the rules.
14	I asked to be on various boards. I don't want to
15	stand here as an outsider. I want to be part of the
16	decision-making process. That's different.
17	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: That's fine. Making those
18	changes, I agree. As I said, this is not a forum where we
19	can effect that change. That's all I'm saying. There is
20	nothing wrong with what you're saying, it's just a form
21	BOARD MEMBER DESAI: Hugh
22	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Did you have something?
23	BOARD MEMBER DESAI: Yeah. I think, I agree
24	100 percent that the ladder kind of designs, but on private

property I don't know how much you can impose on doing

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1	the following the things that is appropriate on a public
2	property, public roadways. So that's my concern.
3	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: We could request it,
4	though. I mean, we've done that before.
5	MR. MURRAY BODIN: You have to approve these
6	plans you can deny or approve these plans until they use
7	the safest crosswalk possible.
8	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Not unless the Codes
9	change, I can't.
10	MR. MURRAY BODIN: What?
11	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Not unless the Codes
12	change, I can't.
13	MR. MURRAY BODIN: Yes, you can.
14	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: No, we can't.
15	VICE CHAIRPERSON HAY: We can't require it if the
16	law doesn't require. We can suggest it.
17	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: If the law doesn't require
18	it that's what I said, we're a ministerial board. We
19	have to follow what the Code says, even if we don't like
20	it, okay. We have to follow the Code, that's our job.
21	MR. MURRAY BODIN: You're telling me that you are
22	not concerned about the safety of the City?
23	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: I didn't say that at all.
24	VICE CHAIRPERSON HAY: No. No.
25	MR. MURRAY BODIN: That's effectively what you're

1	saying
2	VICE CHAIRPERSON HAY: No.
3	MR. MURRAY BODIN: we're going to follow the
4	Code even though we know it's stupid.
5	VICE CHAIRPERSON HAY: We don't have jurisdiction
6	to rule on
7	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: To change it.
8	VICE CHAIRPERSON HAY: other than what is
9	BOARD MEMBER DESAI: Okay, I think that's enough.
10	DEPUTY TOWN ATTORNEY MAGANA: That's enough. I
11	think we got it.
12	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Okay, thank you very much
13	for your time. Is there anybody else from the public that
14	wants to speak on this application?
15	(Whereupon, there was no response.)
16	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Okay. In which case, I'll
17	take a motion to close the Public Hearing and keep the
18	record open until when?
19	DEPUTY COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: September 13th.
20	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Until September 13th. And
21	Ms. Cheng, we will make a decision at our next meeting,
22	okay, is when the decision will be made, which is on
23	September 20th, okay.
24	VICE CHAIRPERSON HAY: I move that we close the
25	Public Hearing and keep the record open until

1	September 13th.
2	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Do I have a second?
3	BOARD MEMBER SNAGGS: Second.
4	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Johan second. All in
5	favor? Aye.
6	VICE CHAIRPERSON HAY: Aye.
7	BOARD MEMBER DESAI: Aye.
8	BOARD MEMBER SNAGGS: Aye.
9	BOARD MEMBER DAVIS: Aye.
10	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: All opposed?
11	(Whereupon, there was no response.)
12	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Okay, that passes. Thank
13	you very much. Now, can I have the motion to close the
14	Public Hearing?
15	DR. DANIEL ZONAN: Hello? Hello?
16	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Mr. Zonan. Dr. Zonan.
17	DR. DANIEL ZONAN: Yes, I'm sorry, I was having
18	trouble unmuting myself. I know you're closing the
19	meeting. Just one quick comment, is that all right?
20	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Sure. Go ahead.
21	DR. DANIEL ZONAN: One of my concerns, looking at
22	the plans, I see the dedicated parking spots for quite a
23	bit of volume of in and out of people coming to the
24	daycare. And right now, those spots are largely being
25	occupied on Central Avenue from the nail salon at 100

Central Avenue.

I also, for the last 40 years, have been utilizing six of those spots. So I don't know if it's in the plans to not allow 100 Central Avenue or myself will no longer have use of those spots.

And in addition to which, when the church runs about four to six times a year, their flea markets, whoever did the traffic study, whoever consulted the police about that in accidents, I've been at that property for 53 years. And I've fought these hundreds of flea markets.

And almost at every single one, there is so much congestion there that there are police assigned to manage the traffic and there are always fender benders there.

Now, I don't think that would be when school is taking place. It's generally on Saturdays.

But my point is, that's a very congested ingress and egress, especially being, a side from the church, aside from the daycare, you have a very busy nail salon. And my office is, I wouldn't say very busy, but, again, occupying six of those spots.

So if they plan to remove the use of the spots from myself and the nail salon, it would have been nice if someone proposed that to us. I haven't heard that from the proposal. And even if that's not the case or is the case, I am concerned about the amount of traffic that's going to

1 be there.

VICE CHAIRPERSON HAY: Has there been an issue the last 36 years when a daycare was operating there?

DR. DANIEL ZONAN: Well, not really, I mean, but there is a lot of little children and parents walking in and walking out and picking up. And it's very congested.

And, you know, at that time, only until recently, as I said, the nail salon has only been utilizing it the last couple of years and the daycare has been extinct for the last couple of years, since Covid. So that interaction has not happened.

But now that Covid is over, and you will be having, if they are going to keep the utilization of those spots with the nail salon and so on, I wouldn't want my child coming in and out of there.

CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Thank you for your comments. Ms. Cheng, do you want to respond to Dr. Zonan, please?

MS. XINGLI CHENG: Yes, actually, I have. So the nursery school is kind of different from daycare. Nursery school, they have the kids, they can like have the kids over three hours. Basically, going to be parents dropping off, pick up, dropping off during the day.

And however, for daycare, parents only drop off in the morning. Then they pick their kids later like, you

know, 5:00 and 5:30. Those are the hours. 1 And my capacity is only 30 kids. I think the 2 daycare, they had a lot more kids than we do, you know, we 3 do. And also, the daycare close early this year. 4 5 And so I don't see there is much difference, you know, like, you know, for us, for us when I look at. So 6 7 basically, you know, we do have not many traffic compared 8 to the nursery school. So I don't --CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: I think the question is, 9 10 though, for the last couple of years, the spaces are on 11 your property, as I understand it, all of them. But for the last couple of years, I guess, the church has allowed 12 13 the nail salon and Dr. Zonan's patients to park on that 14 property. Is that --15 DR. DANIEL ZONAN: Well, no, I --16 CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: No? 17 DR. DANIEL ZONAN: I've been paying for those 18 spots for 40 years. It's not that they are allowing me, 19 but for 40 years. And my question is, I guess maybe that's 20 where you're leading to, is that going to come to an end? 21 And if so, why isn't that --22 CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Are you currently -- you said it was 40. But you said you've been in practice for 23 24 What happened to the other ten? 25 DR. DANIEL ZONAN: Well, I have my own parking

1	lot. And as the practice grew, over the course of time, we
2	needed more parking. So that's why the first ten years or
3	so back in the 60's, it wasn't necessary.
4	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: And now it is? You still
5	need the overflow?
6	DR. DANIEL ZONAN: Yes, for either employee
7	parking or patient parking.
8	VICE CHAIRPERSON HAY: And then how many spaces
9	do you estimate the nail salon uses regularly?
10	DR. DANIEL ZONAN: I believe they use also
11	somewhere between four to six spots. So when I look at
12	this proposal showing 16 spots in that southern parking
13	lot, it seems rather misleading because some of them are
14	occupied.
15	DEPUTY TOWN ATTORNEY MAGANA: I thought it was my
16	understanding that it was a shared lot.
17	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: It obviously is because
18	he's got a rental agreement.
19	DEPUTY TOWN ATTORNEY MAGANA: So we wouldn't
20	restrict use of the particular spaces.
21	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Well, there isn't that.
22	Plus I think we talked about the employees parking around
23	the back of the building anyway.
24	DEPUTY COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: We did.
25	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: So that would free up some

1	of the spaces in that north is that the northwest
2	northeast corner?
3	DEPUTY TOWN ATTORNEY MAGANA: Who actually owns
4	the lot for the parking spaces?
5	DR. DANIEL ZONAN: The church.
6	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: The church.
7	DR. DANIEL ZONAN: The church owns the lot.
8	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Okay. But which spaces
9	are you using? Are you using the ones along Central
10	DR. DANIEL ZONAN: I use okay, they are
11	numbered. So right now, it's one through six. I used to
12	ten or 12 of them. But it's one through six, so from
13	Central Avenue going into the parking lot on the southerly
14	side.
15	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Okay. So now, what we've
16	talked about with Ms. Cheng the last time at the work
17	session, which I'm not sure if you watched
18	DR. DANIEL ZONAN: No.
19	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: was to have their
20	employees park behind the building anyway.
21	DR. DANIEL ZONAN: Right.
22	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Okay, so that would free
23	up a little bit of space for you in the front and not
24	create a big problem, I don't think. But that's
25	something what I think and we still have to have a

1	decision on this.
2	What I suggest is, Ms. Cheng, could you sit down
3	between now and the next meeting with the Doctor and with
4	the nail salon to discuss this and see if you can work
5	something out?
6	BOARD MEMBER SNAGGS: Hugh?
7	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Yes.
8	BOARD MEMBER SNAGGS: It sounds as though
9	DR. DANIEL ZONAN: No, I don't want to
10	BOARD MEMBER SNAGGS: it's with the church and
11	it's a situation between Ms. Cheng
12	DR. DANIEL ZONAN: I'm not trying to be
13	difficult, it's more of a safety concern.
14	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Shhhh. Two people talking
15	at one time.
16	BOARD MEMBER SNAGGS: Are you shushing me or him?
17	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: No, no, I'm saying him.
18	Just hang on for a second. Dr. Zonan, just hold on one
19	second. Go ahead, Johan.
20	BOARD MEMBER SNAGGS: If he has an arrangement
21	with the church
22	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Yeah, you're right.
23	You're right.
24	BOARD MEMBER SNAGGS: then he should have a
25	conversation with the church. And so should Ms. Cheng and

1	so should the nail salon.
2	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: They should all sit down
3	together.
4	BOARD MEMBER SNAGGS: Yes.
5	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: That's a very good point.
6	DR. DANIEL ZONAN: Right. But what I'm saying i
7	no one has approached I have a year lease signed
8	contract for those parking spots. And no one had
9	approached me to say it won't be renewable or it's an
10	issue. So I just thought that was strange. The church
11	hasn't approached me.
12	VICE CHAIRPERSON HAY: We just need to
13	understand, before we approve this, how many spaces are
14	actually going to be available for the daycare
15	DR. DANIEL ZONAN: Right, that's why
16	VICE CHAIRPERSON HAY: versus how many are
17	required for such a facility.
18	DR. DANIEL ZONAN: Right, that's my point.
19	VICE CHAIRPERSON HAY: And we had no idea so
20	thank you for bringing that up. We were not made aware of
21	that.
22	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: One housekeeping thing,
23	all of this I would like to get in the public record
24	officially. Right now it's not because we closed the
25	Public Hearing.

1	So I would like a motion to reopen the Public
2	Hearing and include all of the record of the last since
3	we've originally closed, can I have that motion?
4	BOARD MEMBER SNAGGS: So moved.
5	BOARD MEMBER DAVIS: So moved.
6	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Johan moved. Leslie, you
7	second?
8	BOARD MEMBER DAVIS: Second, yes.
9	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: All in favor? Aye.
10	VICE CHAIRPERSON HAY: Aye.
11	BOARD MEMBER SNAGGS: Aye.
12	BOARD MEMBER DESAI: Aye.
13	BOARD MEMBER DAVIS: Aye.
14	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: All opposed?
15	(Whereupon, there was no response.)
16	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Okay, great. So now the
17	question is, can you guys get there together, all of you,
18	because it sounds like Dr. Zonan has a lease, which I don't
19	know. Did you know about that, Ms. Cheng? It was never in
20	the plans.
21	MS. XINGLI CHENG: Actually, I'm not sure certain
22	things, but based on the conversation with the person
23	talking to the church, he told me someone using, but he
24	never got the payment. So I don't know
25	DR. DANIEL ZONAN: No such thing.

MS. XINGLI CHENG: Okay, but anyway I don't know he talking about you.

CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Dr. Zonan, one person at a time. Go ahead.

DR. DANIEL ZONAN: Sorry.

MS. XINGLI CHENG: Yeah. Yeah. And also, I have to say, by regulation and I only have a capacity of 30 kids. I think mine is maximum, I would say, eight parking spaces would be plenty. Because like I said before, the parents they don't come altogether. So couple don't coming like then another, you know, five, ten minutes.

So nobody going to use that space, other space, that's never happened for that. Because I spoke to the nursery owner, never ever there was any issue even with her capacity. She had a lot more kids.

CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Here's the problem we have right now, Ms. Cheng, okay. The proposal you made is actually inaccurate because it doesn't reflect that there are dedicated spaces on the property.

And if Dr. Zonan and potentially the nail salon have leases, those are dedicated spaces currently, which we should have known about them. Before we make a decision, okay, I'm not saying that precludes you from making a decision.

Dr. Zonan, did you want to say something?

1	DR. DANIEL ZONAN: I have a signed contract with
2	the church that is renewed yearly. I have 30 such
3	contracts.
4	So there is no and the trustee of the church,
5	who is ever on, Lewellyn(ph), is the one who's he's an
6	attorney. He draws up these contracts every year. He's a
7	very nice gentleman. I have a wonderful relationship with
8	the church.
9	And by no means am I trying to be a stumbling
10	block to this daycare. I want to be a good neighbor. My
11	only concern is, if there is not enough parking spots
12	And I will say this, over the years when the
13	nursery school was there, they were always in my parking
14	spots. But to be neighborly, even though I was paying for
15	them, it was a short stay, dropoff/pickup like this woman
16	is saying. So no harm no foul.
17	But there were many occasions where my employees
18	or my patients would come to their dedicated spots and
19	there were parents of these children in those spots.
20	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: I understand. Go ahead,
21	Kirit.
22	BOARD MEMBER DESAI: So where is your office
23	located in this one? You are on the other side of the
24	building?

DR. DANIEL ZONAN: I'm the adjacent property

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1	south. 116 North Central Avenue, Wedgwood Professional
2	Center, the adjacent building to the church.
3	BOARD MEMBER DESAI: So how do you cross the
4	thing, is there a sidewalk that you take to?
5	DR. DANIEL ZONAN: There is a path that leads
6	from that parking lot right into my property. They don't
7	have to cross anything, but the spots are on the side of my
8	property.
9	BOARD MEMBER DESAI: Yeah, I think so it's not
10	part of this property or proposal. I'm a little confused
11	about the
12	BOARD MEMBER DAVIS: If I may?
13	BOARD MEMBER DESAI: Yes.
14	DEPUTY COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: See staff can
15	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Okay, this is what we're
16	going to do, guys.
17	BOARD MEMBER DESAI: Leslie has a comment.
18	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Leslie, did you want to
19	say something?
20	BOARD MEMBER DAVIS: I do. I'm just looking at
21	what I believe is the lease for the daycare center and
22	there is a square footage that's mentioned there. So I do
23	believe that may be that does need to be cleared up. So as
24	you said, we're making a decision on the right side of the
25	property.

CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Right. 1 BOARD MEMBER DAVIS: Because how are they leasing 2 3 it to her and leasing it to him? CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Sounds like it may be. 4 5 this is what I think we should do, okay, is I would just like to leave the Public Hearing open right now rather than 6 7 close it. 8 And I would like Aaron to kind of help facilitate a discussion with all the parties and the church, which I 9 10 think is what has to happen to resolve this, okay. And 11 then we will discuss it at the next meeting. 12 If it's resolved quickly, we can always change --13 We can close the Public Hearing quickly at the next meeting 14 and still make a decision that night. It just depends on 15 the progress of it. 16 But right now, this, frankly, you're going to 17 have to modify the application anyway, I think. Because 18 the application doesn't reflect Dr. Zonan's spaces or these 19 spaces, which it has to do to be accurate. So we need to 20 update it anyway. 21 Let's leave the Public Hearing open until the 22 next meeting, okay. And we will just adjourn it tonight. 23 Aaron will be in touch with you guys.

Dr. Zonan, does Aaron have your email address?

And do you have Aaron's email address?

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1	DEPUTY COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Yes.
2	DR. DANIEL ZONAN: Yes. He has my email address.
3	And again, I am not trying to be difficult.
4	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: No. No. I understand. I
5	understand.
6	VICE CHAIRPERSON HAY: We don't feel you are. If
7	you have a lease, you know, it gives you some rights.
8	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Amanda?
9	DEPUTY TOWN ATTORNEY MAGANA: It would be helpful
10	to know the hours of operation for the existing businesses.
11	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Yes.
12	DEPUTY TOWN ATTORNEY MAGANA: And to see
13	DR. DANIEL ZONAN: I'm six days a week. I'm
14	there every day, but Sunday.
15	DEPUTY TOWN ATTORNEY MAGANA: What hours? Is it
16	9:00 to 5:00, 8:00 to 6:00?
17	DR. DANIEL ZONAN: Well, no, no, unfortunately
18	DEPUTY TOWN ATTORNEY MAGANA: To see what kind of
19	overlap of a traffic pattern for the parking.
20	DR. DANIEL ZONAN: Being a doctor's office and we
21	are there for emergencies, regular hours are from 8:00 to
22	5:00. But very often I'm there later. I get there at 6:30
23	every morning. And you know, if there are emergencies, I'm
24	there later. But generally it would be from 8:00 to 5:00.
25	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: So same hours, basically,

1	as the operation of the facility.
2	DEPUTY COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: I did have one
3	question. Do you have any dedicated parking for your
4	office on your own site?
5	DR. DANIEL ZONAN: I do. And as I said, we kind
6	of, as we got a larger practice, that's when we approached
7	the church was, again, about almost 40 years ago, and we've
8	been renting those spots ever since.
9	DEPUTY COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Very good. Thank
10	you.
11	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Okay. Well, I think all
12	of that needs to be worked out to see if there is a way of
13	doing this that works for everybody. The good thing is, it
14	isn't the nursery school which has a different dynamic,
15	dropoff and pickup dynamic than the daycare center does.
16	Because they are more staggered than the daycare
17	center, which should be helpful and mitigate your issue to
18	some extent. Plus, we've already agreed to park the
19	employees behind the building away from your spaces. So
20	that helps as well.
21	DR. DANIEL ZONAN: Okay, right.
22	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: But
23	DR. DANIEL ZONAN: If it can be worked out, I'm
24	fine with it. You know, if you guys are satisfied and it
25	can work out, there is no problem here.

1	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Okay. Dr. Zonan, what
2	we're going to do, as I said, we're going to leave the
3	Hearing open. Aaron will be in contact with everybody and
4	try to get a joint meeting with the church and figure this
5	whole thing out.
6	Also, he probably has to run it by the traffic
7	consultant and the building inspector to make sure that
8	we're still in compliance, okay.
9	DR. DANIEL ZONAN: Yeah.
10	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: He will do all of that.
11	If it gets done fast, next week, we can still close the
12	Public Hearing on the 20th and may be even make a decision
13	on the 20th.
14	It all depends on the progress of next week. But
15	for now, I am going to adjourn the Public Hearing. I don't
16	need a motion to do that. I'm just going to adjourn it.
17	DEPUTY COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: I think you do.
18	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Okay, I'll take a motion
19	to adjourn the Public Hearing.
20	BOARD MEMBER SNAGGS: So moved.
21	VICE CHAIRPERSON HAY: Second.
22	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Second is Tom. All in
23	favor? Aye.
24	VICE CHAIRPERSON HAY: Aye.
25	BOARD MEMBER SNAGGS: Aye.

1	BOARD MEMBER DESAI: Aye.
2	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Leslie?
3	BOARD MEMBER DAVIS: Aye.
4	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Thank you. Kirit, did you
5	say aye?
6	BOARD MEMBER DESAI: Yes.
7	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Okay. All opposed?
8	(Whereupon, there was no response.)
9	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Abstentions?
10	(Whereupon, there was no response.)
11	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Okay. So we are going to
12	adjourn the Public Hearing. Now, can I have a motion to
13	close the Public Hearing of
14	VICE CHAIRPERSON HAY: Session.
15	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: tonight's meeting.
16	Thank you for finishing my sentence.
17	VICE CHAIRPERSON HAY: So moved. Sorry.
18	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Second?
19	BOARD MEMBER SNAGGS: Second.
20	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: I know we're close, but
21	not that close. All in favor? Aye.
22	VICE CHAIRPERSON HAY: Aye.
23	BOARD MEMBER SNAGGS: Aye.
24	BOARD MEMBER DESAI: Aye.
25	BOARD MEMBER DAVIS: Aye.

1	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: All opposed?
2	(Whereupon, there was no response.)
3	CHAIRPERSON SCHWARTZ: Okay.
4	DEPUTY COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Thank you.
5	(Whereupon, the Public Hearing was concluded.)
